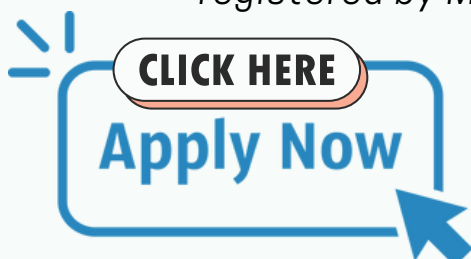

National Cybersecurity
Teaching Academy

The National Cyber Security Teaching Academy (NCTA) is an 18-credit hour online graduate certificate program for high school teachers. Cohort 2 is beginning this summer, June 2024. We are offering the first course for free as professional development, with an opportunity to earn graduate credit.

- Foundations of Cyber Security is the first of six graduate-level courses in the National Cybersecurity Teaching Academy program.
- The course covers the big ideas of cybersecurity and the CIA triad (confidentiality, integrity, and availability)
- The course is administered asynchronously online via Canvas LMS from June 1 - Aug 31, 2024. With modules released every 2 weeks
- Up to 45 hours of professional development or graduate credit *can be* earned.
 - The NCTA certificate requires the completion of 18 credit hours (equivalent to 6 courses), aligning with the requirement in many states for teachers to teach dual/concurrent credit.
 - *A proctored exam is required to receive graduate credit. Participants must pay any fees associated with the exam.*
 - *Professional Development is free for all certified US K-12 Teachers registered by May 1, 2024.*
