Program Overview and Learning Outcomes


Program Overview

- The IUP Chinese Language Immersion Program is a pilot program for cybersecurity students to expand their Chinese language skills. IUP is the only university in the nation to offer a program of this kind.
- The 10-week program was offered June 3, 2024 through August 9, 2024.

Learning Outcomes

- Recognize and write down each syllable in Pinyin of any Chinese words, phrases, and sentences.
- Understand the forms and meaning of conversations and narratives that match entry level on topics regarding greeting, scheduling, dining, shopping, and traveling; and (2) the pragmatics and associated cultural points behind.
- Recognize and understand high-frequency cybersecurity words, phrases, and simple sentences in Chinese.
- Pronounce each syllable in the Pinyin chart with four tones and to read aloud words, phrases, and sentences correctly.
- Communicate on daily topics and apply high-frequency words and expressions in cybersecurity.
- Read and understand Chinese text with assistance of online tools and/or apps.
- Type Hanzi on electronic devices (including finger writing on touchscreen devices) any Chinese text seen.
- Write sentences and paragraphs on use of vocabulary in a comprehensible and appropriate manner for real world tasks.
- · Use resources and tools in Chinese learning and discuss learning strategies including reflecting on their own experience.
- Discuss understanding of Chinese culture in comparison and contrast with American culture.

Marketing and Application Development

Marketing

Marketing of the program began in September 2023 with the creation of the project website, a poster presentation at the 2023 NCEC in Chicago, design of a flyer, brochure, posts on social media, and a targeted email campaign.

Application Criteria

Applications were accepted through December 2023 and students were required to submit the following:

- Academic Information
- Previous Chinese language experience/course work
- 500-word personal essay
- Two professor recommendations
- Self-evaluation of Chinese proficiency


- Free including travel, lodging, meals and events.

- Preference given to applicants with prior knowledge of the Chinese language.
- Applicants must be US citizens or permanent residents.




Participant Selection


- 80 applications were received.
- A database was created, and all applications were evaluated by the Program Team.
- Applications were scored based on the following scale:
 - Academic Performance (45%)
 - Recommendations (30%)
 - Personal Essay (15%)
 - Language Proficiency (10%)
- The 15 students with the highest scores were chosen to participate in the program and split into two groups based on Chinese language proficiency and experience.





- nmunity Assignment Summary: Create a video documenting and reflecting on program experience to showcase learning and proficiency. Students should speak at minimum 50 sentences, include at least 10 pictures, and add subtitles in English and Chinese.

• **Two Participant Groups:** After review of applications, it was determined that splitting the highest scoring candidates into two groups based on self-reported skill level would provide a more beneficial program to all. Additional instructors were hired to provide instruction to both groups, and skill levels were also evaluated at the start of the program.

Challenges

- Limited Amenities: Due to campus construction projects and cost-reducing measures over summer, only one dining hall was open and fitness/health centers had limited hours. Participants would have made use of campus facilities if more were available.
- First Residential Offering: This was the first residential program of this scale offered by program leadership. We had to navigate challenges coordinating with many departments across campus and beyond.



Lessons Learned and Future Improvements

Application Process

- Recommendation letters need to be sent directly to program staff.
- Applicants should be selected and notified as early as possible to facilitate:
 - Securing the approval to create university exception accounts.
 - Communicating with accepted students using their official university email accounts.
 - Issuing university ID cards as early as possible.

Program Improvements

- Clear deadlines for assignments/projects will be added to the online course to avoid confusion and ensure consistency.
- Tutoring sessions will be required for participants who earn less than satisfactory on assignments.
- Participants will be required to enroll in direct deposit to avoid payment delays.
- Striking a balance between the immersive and learning activities.




Academic Year 2024-25 Activities

Activities are being offered throughout AY 2024-25 to expand on content delivered during the Summer 2024 program. These activities include the following:

Synchronous Monthly Meetings

- Three hours of synchronous meetings are held each month of the fall 2024 and spring 2025 semesters for a total of 24 hours.
- Participants are required to attend a minimum of six synchronous meetings to receive the remainder of their participation stipend.

 Professional tutors were hired and have provided over 45 sessions to participants since late fall 2024.



Conclusion/Questions

Program Highlights

- The only program of its kind offered nationally.
- Recruited a highly qualified instruction team and 15 very promising college students from 15 universities representing 12 states.
- 80 applications received and evaluated.
- 11 instructors and assistants identified and hired.
- 40% of selected participants are female.
- The student-to-teacher ratio was 1.5 to 1.
- Over 200 hours of language instruction provided.
- Over 40 hours of tutoring.
- 24 hours of additional synchronous instruction for each group throughout AY 2024-25.
- One-on-one speaking and tutoring sessions throughout AY 2024-25.
